BEQUEST - A charitable bequest in your estate plan is a simple way to make a legacy gift to CAPSC while enjoying the assets you need to maintain your current lifestyle. You can make a bequest by adding specific language to an existing will or drafting a new one.

General Bequest Language: "I give, devise, and bequeath to Community Action Partnership of Strafford County in Dover, New Hampshire, the sum of \$_____ (or a description of the specific asset), for the benefit of Community Action Partnership of Strafford County and its general purposes."

LIFE INSURANCE - Life insurance gives you the opportunity to make a significant gift with tax benefits you can enjoy during your lifetime. Whether you donate an older policy you no longer need, or start a new policy to benefit CAPSC, life insurance offers a unique way to leverage a larger gift than you thought possible.



RETIREMENT ASSETS - By naming Community Action Partnership of Strafford County as the beneficiary of the remainder of your IRAs or other retirement benefit plans, you may be able to avoid significant taxation for your family after your passing.

GIFTS OF APPRECIATED ASSETS - Gifts of appreciated assets can include stocks, property, or other tangible assets that have appreciated in value. Giving a gift of appreciated stocks, other securities, or assets may have considerable tax benefits and may entitle you to an income tax charitable deduction for the fair market value of the asset on the date of your gift. This benefits you by allowing you to make a gift while costing you less, and it may help you avoid a capital gains liability.
